The range was in fine shape on Friday when we arrived for set-up. Appy Dan (Dan Glor), Bedlam (Ben Stewart), Bjorn E. Ville (Eric Simonson), Carlsbad Kid (Karl Mayer), G.D Rattler (Bill Hanson), J. J. Wainwright (Darin Puryear) along with his 9 year old son Buddy Wainwright (Braxton Puryear), Just Dan D. (Dan DuPertius), The Elder Katie (Karen Jennings), and T-Bone Shorty (Terry Sporrong) came out to help, and the stayed to assist me in hosting the Steel Dragons for a chance to shoot our cowboy guns in an abbreviated cowboy stage (One pistol loaded with five rounds, a rifle with 5, and a double-barrel shotgun and four rounds). Our top three finishers were: Rick O'Shea (Russ Siverling) in third place, Mudflat Mike in Second, and Lawbreaker taking home First.

Sunday was cloudier with a bit of drizzle until the end of the match when the rain started in earnest.

16 cowboys came out, but we had only one shoot the match clean, Aldo Bridger (Kyle Cooper). Our top three gunslingers this day were: In third place, R.P Dodge (Rick Otto), Jus Nobody (Barry Turner) in second, and Bjorn E. Ville was our fastest gun-hawk of the day.

There were no DQ's either day, and \$330.00 was turned into the Club.

Commentary

Revenues in May were \$51,354.82 representing a 58% increase over April. The club saw decreased expenses compared to April which led to healthy financial results for the club. As the weather outside improves and membership renewal season hits, the clubs' financial results should continue to be healthy through the summer allowing us to continue to build our financial reserve.

The club recorded \$51,354.82 in revenue and generated a net income of \$23,628.89 for the month.

Revenue Report

The large increase in club revenue was driven by membership income which increased by \$20,998.02 or by a factor of 6. May and June are expected to be the highest months for membership revenue as renewals are due in June. Membership revenue accounted for 48% of our total revenue this month. Rifle/pistol range revenue increased by 17% while shotgun revenue held relatively steady. Merchandise sales increased by 29% but represented only 23.7% of our total revenues in May. The only negative in our revenue for May was that match revenue was down by 32%

2. Subcommittee for proposed changes on creating a software-based solution that would make a better solution for tracking members, the general public and give the range masters the ability to track when a customer is asked to leave the range (Karen, Diana, Aushim & Aaron).

They were here on June 14th and 15th. 50+ beginner dogs were present, and they loved the facility. They gave the club an additional \$400
7. Action bay upper berm repair, on top of bays 4 and 5 (Steve).
*Need a larger machine to move the blocks. Scott contacted Sam.
Schedule the work to start the week of August 9th. Rifle and Pistol would be shut down.
Potentially leave action bays 1 – 3 open*
8. The facing on the North side of the club house needs repaired and painted (Ted).
Will get quotes and a schedule
9. One-day garage sale on July 18th (Diana)
Flier has been distributed. There has been some interest.
10. RSO2's in the action bays with children (as their second person). The Directors discussed this at the executive meeting.
Decision: *Scott Johnson and the action bay committee will create a policy and process for additional training for minors.
Scott has shared a draft with the committee.*
11. Audit request: Karen has asked for estimates.

New Business:

1. Safety Items for June:
 - a. Range is following all COVID-19 guidance and practices.
 - b. No other items to report
2. Randy Hill asked the Board to nominate Diana Pinto for a life membership.
3. Dick Lichtenberg gave a report on the Olympic bunker shoots. Also reported on the number of shooters who have gone onto the Olympics and World Cups from Renton. He also reported on the current Olympics.

4. Aushim will be updating our POS software on July 12th and 13th. Our current version will not be supported after August 10th.
5. Derek asked if the firewood will be moved before Westmatch. Response: it will not be until someone splits it and puts it in the baskets.
6. Scott Pontrelli asked about what time the shotgun range is supposed to be closed. He said he has come in around five and it has already been closed. Ted said they should be open and for him to talk with the rangemaster.
Scott also mentioned that he cannot tell when the traps are closed if the signs are used, and the cones are not. Additional discussion took place.
