



The meeting was called to order by President Karen J at 7:02 p.m. March 2, 2006.

Board Members in attendance: Bob B, Dan C, Brian H, Karen J, Ted P, Dave R, Bob W, Ken W, and Rob W.

Minutes: The February Board Minutes were read and approved with no corrections.

Committee Reports:

Firearms Safety: Gary said the March and July classes are full, and at this point the May class is half full.

Grounds: Casey has the slats for the fence at the shotgun range here. He found 2 frozen faucets last month. One on the rifle range, and one on the shotgun range. He put a bonnet on both of them. People are reminded to please disconnect hoses from the faucet when they are finished using them.

I.D.P.A: Rob W said they had 43 shooters, and made money.

I.P.S.A: IPSC had 40 shooters, and turned in money to the club.

Membership: None

Rifle & Pistol: Dave R reported the rifle range income with 186 Adult shooters, and 21 Juniors.

Safety: Glen reported that they had a person walk out in front of the firing line, when it was hot. After a discussion with the man, he was asked to leave.

Shotgun/Skeet: Ted said that Continental League had 26 Squads, and that the practice trap was not working well, but despite that the League went fine. He stated that they turned in money to the club. They are looking at replacing the Winchester with a BioMat they found. Ted requested they be allowed to purchase a machine. Ted made a motion, Bob B seconded it, motion passed.

Bob B mentioned a member should be given a one years membership for all the work he does on the range. Bob B made the motion, Ken W seconded it. Motion passed.

Old Business: None.

New Business: It was determined that Casey will be able to make the fishing rod for the friends of the N.R.A. Banquet after all. His wife is recovering, and he has a little more time to work on the project.

The Action Bays are \$25.00 per Bay up to 4 Bays, or \$100.00 for all.

To use the kitchen people will be required to pay a \$100.00 deposit, which will be refunded after inspection to see that it has been properly cleaned.

Youth groups and schools will be exempted from fees.
