Feb. work party did a good job, but was only a start.

1. Culvert between entrance road and 1 71 St. I called King County and they put out a work order to clean up and open culvert.
2. Removal of old tires. about 75 to 80
 1. At Renton recycle day, everyone take 4 tires in. Cost free.
 2. In Kent if you are a resident, you can take in 8 tires a family. cost free if under 1 8 inches, over \$1 .50, truck tires \$5.00
 3. Les Schwab will take them. Cost \$3.00 to \$5.00
 4. A recycle place called 1 877 old tyre (Terry 1/253-460-6329) Will come and haul them away. Cost \$1.1 3, with rim \$3.58. Tires are to be clean and no debris.

Bob Bracco made a motion that we have the tires removed. The motion was seconded and approved by the board.

3. The fence line has been neglected for to long.

The East side has about 20 sections need of repair just out to the 200 yard line and small trees and brush needs removed.

Out to 300 berm fence is broken and another 10 sections need work. the next 50 yards has a large tree down along the fence taking out 2 post and 3 sections. Past this point it's a jungle, and we didn't go any farther north.

The fence line does not have any kind of trail or fire break around it.

4. The property has a lot of alders that are dying off. Come spring we can fall those that are dead and are a hazard.
5. The shed on the rifle range is almost done, and we will be storing shooting supplies (target stands, ect.) (not cowboy or hunter safety target stands) than we will clean up and move general supplies and tools in the storage room off the pistol range.

Glenn has an estimate of \$2000 for eight cameras and a recorder. He will get additional estimates
