- Bay 7 still has wood boards leaning on the block wall also chip boards leaning on the back of the shed. These need to be protected from the coming rains, if they are to be kept or they should be removed from the area.

Right now they are doing Black Diamond, then Ft Lewis this summer. There is no cost to us. Estimates are 270,000 lbs of lead on the hill.
