**August Grounds Report**

We prepared for the incoming excavator and with it we dug out the electrical ditch between the two sheds and placed the two large tires at the 200-yard line for shooting steel. Tapered the bank behind the 100-yard line and the flat behind, and flattened blackberry bushes between bay 4 and the rifle range.

Dale completed the electoral to the new shed.

Rob Laird started watering the trees along the rifle range out to the 300-yard berm.

The crew also kept up with general cleanup and target backers.

What we need now is some loads of crushed cement to cover our new parking spaces we have created. Crushed asphalt would also be nice to have.

If any younger then my Monday crew could come out and cut down the weeds and brush along the entrance road, which is in badly in need of, we would greatly appreciate the help (update: Dale trimmed along the entrance road). A lot of the range needs trimming – we still need the rest of the range trimmed.

I will turn over the time to either Scott and/or Steve to report on the test they ran shooting at the large tires. Scott reported that they tried several calibers and the tire worked well with all of them.

We packed 210 shooters through the match Friday-Sunday on 10 stages + a Chronograph stage. I have collected lots of great feedback. Lots of happy people, some with constructive feedback but overwhelmingly happy people.

# Action Shooting International (ASI), Scott Johnson / Robb Wolfe

The monthly ASI match was held on July 9th.

There were 7 stages, 7 squads, and 104 shooters. There was one DQ due to a shooter breaking the 180.

\$1,595 was turned into the club.

The next regular match will be on August 13<sup>th</sup>.

The annual Hand-Sized championship (HSH22) was held on July 30<sup>th.</sup> We had 92 participants who shot 8 stages. "Hand-Sized" required the people competing to use a pistol that had a barrel length of less than 3 inches and to only load six rounds in each magazine. Those who did not want to compete in that category, could use their normal ASI equipment.

After expenses for trophies, \$1,241 was turned into the club

There were two safety incidents:

- A person tripped and fell in bay five, he hit his face and cut his forehead. He was treated at the range and felt fine enough to drive home after the match.
- A person had a heat related illness. We called 911, the Renton Fire Department responded quickly, and he was transported to the hospital.

#### **Old Business:**

- 1. Dave asked if Roy could provide electricity to the Wi-Fi transmitters in the action bays. Status: *Will be delayed for a few months.*
- Come up with a plan to establish a volunteer RO program, to include requirements of volunteers, limits of authority and any discounts to membership. Karen Status: Will discuss at the Directors meeting on the 18th
- New financial and membership system for the club Georgia
   Status: On hold until all the issues are resolved with QuickBooks. No Change until I can get more time off work
- 4. John Palmer: Labor & Industries visit. L&I provided an industrial hygiene consultation report letter and sample safety programs templates we can use as a reference to update our programs. Status: No progress. Need someone at the range to help put the information together. Ted will ask Jim to help.
- 5. Addressing issues on the Pistol Range (baffle replacement, a new short berm in front of the 10-yard target stands (similar to what is in front of the 25-yard targets) and adding angled steel plate to the baffles (as is done at indoor ranges) LaMarr Status: There have been other issues they are addressing. Still need to talk with Mark about the steel. Ted may have steel from the pattern board.
- 6. Ted is looking at other options for catching the shot (current cloth is not working) on the shotgun range.

Status: Will put it up on Monday

- 7. Karen The referendum regarding the high-capacity magazine ban. *Status: Failed, however there is a lawsuit.*
- 8. Dave WIFI at the range.

Status: The equipment has arrived, now need to connect it to the computer

9. Mike Beck - Trophy case for the Crushers.

Status: In work

10. Diana Pinto – Action Bay Day.

We had a good turnout for what we hope is the first of many Action Bay Days. IDPA/USPSA, Cowboy and Steel Challenge all jumped in and put on a stage. Steel Challenge also grilled up some very tasty lunches, proceeds of which went to their program. We had a total of 15 shooters, bringing in \$182.00.

- 12. Oregon pistol permits renewal LaMarr reported that he did his on-line through Multnomah County
- 13. Ted purchased a pressure washer

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Safety Items for July:
  - a. Andrew Ranson reported: "On Friday July 29, at approximately 1 PM. After zeroing two rifles, I proceeded to transition over to the pistol side where I wanted to get some practice with a pistol caliber carbine. When I approached the pistol range, I noticed that the lights were flashing to indicate a cease-fire/cold range, and there were shooters downrange from the firing line. However, the chains were not stretched across the opening to the firing line as to prevent access. This was a clear violation of the most basic of RFGC's safety protocols."

Ted spoke with Andrew and the Rangemasters and they will ensure the chains are up.

- 2. Directors only meeting will be held on August 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30PM
- 3. Gary asked if the large concrete chunks in the action bays. LaMarr and Steve said that they will bring in gravel to cover up the chunks. Gary also asked about where the Fire Department would connect to a hydrant if there was a fire on the property. Steve said it would be about \$200K to put in our own hydrants.
- 4. Karen said that we need additional air conditioning in the rifle range office. She will investigate a system for them.
- 5. Karen was talking with the staff, and they were asking about a water dispenser for the rifle range and the shotgun range. Karen will follow up.
- 6. There is a need for the company to pump the action bay portable bathrooms. Ted noted that it needs to be scheduled before any major match.
- 7. Some of the benches on the shotgun range have broken slats. The Monday crew will take care of it.
